**A Level Leavers:**

Of our 2018 leavers, 100% of pupils who applied to university have been placed, or 93% of Year 13 gained a university place. Of these, 64% got their first choice, 25% got their second choice and 29% have gone to Russell Group universities. Year 13 HCS students have gone to a prestigious group of universities, including York, Cardiff, Birmingham, Southampton, Nottingham and Queen Mary's College, London. They have gone to read a wide variety of disciplines, including architecture, business, economics, engineering, geography, history, journalism, languages, law, music and ship science.

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
